**SUNDAY, MAY 17, 10AM
"WOMEN'S WORK"
REV. KATIE LEE CRANE**

It might surprise you to learn that women ministers are nothing new to First Parish of Sudbury. Although the Rev. Katie Lee Crane has served First Parish as its settled minister for 10 years, the congregation's first female minister, Ida Hultin, served from 1904 to 1915. This Sunday, May 17, Crane will reflect on the roles Hultin and other women have played in Unitarian Universalist history. There are many firsts and milestones. For example, Olympia Brown was the first woman to be sanctioned by a national denomination for ordination to the Universalist ministry in the US in 1863.

"Today there are more women than men serving as Unitarian Universalist ministers," Crane says. "Many of us stand on the shoulders of women of the 18th and 19th centuries who bucked convention to live out a call to liberal religious ministry. Some were ordained; others were not. But sanctioned or not, they would not be stopped. They were itinerant preachers and settled ministers. They were abolitionists, suffragists and social reformers. They were, like Elizabeth Peabody and Margaret Fuller, often a primary influence behind the more famous male voices of the Transcendentalist movement."

In addition to highlighting the remarkable history of women in the Universalist, Unitarian and, since 1961, the Unitarian Universalist (UU) denomination, Crane asks this provocative question: Where are the men? She fears that, in the UU denomination at least, we've reached a tipping point and ministry (like nursing, clerical work and social work) is becoming "woman's work."

WHAT THE REC IS ALL ABOUT:

The mission of the REC is to, working with the Director of Religious Exploration and Youth Advisor (DRE), Roberta Altamari, to oversee the RE program for people of all ages. Much of their work focuses on RE for children from birth through 8th grade, the Coming of Age program and Our Whole Lives sexuality education program. (Youth programming for high-schoolers is overseen by the Youth Adult Committee.)

A subcommittee of the REC is the Spirit Play Task Force focusing on children ages 4-10 using the curriculum "Spirit Play" a Montessori-based exploration program, a unique and exploration-based curriculum. Curriculum includes age-appropriate lessons on UUism and its principles and sources "rainbow promises", teachings from the world's religions, themes of compassion, peace, justice, the individual's search for truth and meaning-making, and interdependence.

The REC is made up of members who attend meetings, discuss policies and procedures and serve as a "brain trust" to the DRE, and manage the many and varied initiatives of the REC, which vary from year to year.
